CONGREGATIONS CELEBRATE A DESTINY TOGETHER

About 200 people from six Congregations gathered at Living Faith UC, Carina Heights, on October 7 to celebrate their commitment to continue on their Destiny Together journey. The service included prayers for the members of the Implementation Team (*some of whom are pictured during the service*), which is now working towards a more detailed proposal for Congregations to consider in 2019, and three JNCs (The new Presbytery placement – the Southside Collaboration Lead Ministry Agent; and new ministry agents in short-term placements for Living Faith and St Marks UCs). In addition to Living Faith and St Marks, Destiny Together includes Yeronga, Holland Park, Wellers Hill & Y Tarragindi, and (from Moreton Rivers Presbytery) Faith Works UC (Coorparoo and Norman Park).

FAREWELL SERVICE FOR REV. DONA SPENCER

Attendees of the four regular Sunday services at Southport UC packed into the church together on Sunday morning, October 7, to celebrate the ministry of Rev. Dona Spencer who concluded her placement on September 30 after seven years. Nominations now open for Presbytery roles, committees

Elections will be held at the AGM component of the Presbytery meeting on November 10 for the following roles:

- Presbytery Chair (up to 3-year term)
- Chair, Pastoral Relations Committee (up to 3-year term).
- Chair, Mission Resource Committee (up to 3-year term).
- 2 members, Presbytery Standing Committee (1-year term)
- Up to 6 members, Pastoral Relations Committee (1-year term)
- Up to 6 members, Mission Resource Committee (1-year term)

Nominations are now open and will close on Tuesday, November 6.

Nominees must be confirmed members of the Uniting Church within the Presbytery. UCA Regulations require that a majority of the membership of these committees must be members of the Presbytery, but nominations are welcomed from people who are not Presbytery members.

Presbytery will strive to maintain a balance of ages, gender and lay/ordained across the membership of its committees, and it actively encourages this diversity to be reflected among the people nominating for election. For membership of PRC and MRC, at least two of the elected members must be lay and two ordained. Standing Committee will seek one lay and one ordained elected member.

Details of nominations received will be included in the meeting documents sent to Presbytery members on Wednesday, November 7.

Role descriptions, information sheets and nomination forms are available from the Presbytery Office, or please contact the Presbytery Minister to discuss.

The Standing Committee meets the fourth Tuesday of each month, 5:00-9:00 pm, at the Presbytery office. It acts on behalf of the Presbytery between Presbytery meetings and has certain delegated powers. The provision of two elected members is a new provision which will come to the November meeting for approval among several by-law changes relating to committee membership, but nominations are being called in anticipation of approval. Chaired by Presbytery Chair.

The Pastoral Relations Committee meets the first Tuesday of each month except January, 5:00-9:00 pm, at Beenleigh Region UC. Dinner is included. Broadly, its responsibilities relate to oversight of ministry agents, placements/positions and Congregations, and it has certain delegated powers (see UCA Regs 3.7.3). The Chair is ex officio on Standing Committee.

The Mission Resource Committee meets the second Tuesday of every second month (February, April, June, August, October, December), 7:00-9:00 pm, at Beenleigh Region UC. Broadly, its responsibilities relate to oversight of property and Congregational finances, with certain delegated powers. The Chair is ex officio on Standing Committee.

Note to Presbytery members:

Standing Committee has approved changes to our existing by-laws relating to membership of Presbytery committees. These will be recommended to the November 10 meeting for approval, prior to the AGM elections. Details of the proposed changes will be sent to Presbytery members in the next few days. The only changes to elected positions is the addition of two for Standing Committee and reductions in the numbers sought for PRC and MRC. If these changes are not endorsed at the meeting, the elections can still proceed on the basis of the current by-laws and the nominations received.

Have your say on Synod meetings, Moderator's term, etc

How often should Synod meet? What should be the role and membership of Synod Standing Committee? What about the Moderator's responsibilities and term of office? Should Synod's ministry oversight committees (including Placements and Chaplaincy Commission) be consolidated into one? Should Synod reference groups be Presbytery-based?

These questions have been put out for Presbyteries, Church Councils and Congregations to consider, with responses due November 1. This consultation is part of an extended project by the Synod Standing Committee reviewing the way the Synod as a council of the church exercises its governance responsibilities. This includes the nature of Synod committees and commissions, the nature of leadership in the church, the way decisions are made by leaders and the way we communicate and consult with each other.

Presbytery is offering an opportunity for interested people to gather and discuss the issues in this paper. This will be on **Monday, October 29, 10:00-12:00, in the Cromwell Room, downstairs at Beenleigh Region UC** (32-50 Mt Warren Blvd, Mt Warren Park). This is an open invitation. Key points from the discussion will be noted and conveyed to the Synod. Morning tea will be provided and the room has limited capacity, so [please register your intention to attend online here](#).

Congregation allocations – deadline for review requests

Congregation Treasurers will have received a letter from the Presbytery Treasurer proposing their church's contribution for 2019 to the Combined Presbyteries Mission Pool (formerly known as the Mission & Service Fund). Please bring this to your Church Council meeting, and advise the Presbytery Office (office@southmoreton.org.au) of your acceptance, or if you are seeking a reconsideration.

As stated in the letter, **any requests for a review of the proposed allocation must be received in time for consideration by Standing Committee on October 23**. The Presbytery will be confirming the figure as your 2019 contribution to the CPMP with Synod Finance and Property after the Presbytery meeting of 10 November 2018 and it is very difficult to make a change to any contributions after this date.

Redress cost recoveries – from 1 July 2019

The Synod Standing Committee has determined that payments associated with redress and civil litigation relating to historical instances of child sexual abuse will be funded through a whole-of-church cost recovery scheme. This follows a consultation paper circulated earlier this year. Congregations and schools will be among the UCA entities paying (retrospectively) a share of the costs incurred each financial year. The first payments will be confirmed and due in July 2019 based on total costs for the financial year to 30 June 2019.

And the Synod has provided [an online calculator](#) to indicate an early estimate of likely costs for your entity, using the contribution formula based on insured property value (building and contents) and total revenue.

Children's Ministry Network Breakfast

The next Children's Ministry Network Breakfast will be **Saturday, October 20, 8:00-11:00 am, at Beenleigh Region UC**. Guest speaker will be Rev. Alison Cox. For the past two years, Alison has been developing the ORCA Project with Wesley Mission Qld. This is a post-school option for young people with disability that includes training, work experience and, ultimately, employment. It is also an opportunity to build capacity, enhance lives and find meaningful connections in the community. Alison has an inspiring story to tell. We'll also be sharing resources and ideas.

Presbytery Minister's reflection

Jean Vanier is one of my heroes of the faith. The son of a Canadian diplomat and later Governor-General, Vanier began with a career as a naval officer, then moved into academia as a teacher and author in philosophy. But his life work emerged when, through a Catholic priest, he became aware of the plight of people with disabilities who were almost universally permanently institutionalised. A simple gesture of friendship – inviting two such men into his home in France – began what is now an international movement, L'Arche (The Ark), operating 147 communities in 35 countries, and on five continents, including eight communities across Australia. Central to the L'Arche philosophy are households where people with and without intellectual disability live and work alongside each other in relationships of mutuality and trust, with each person acknowledging their need and capacity to give and receive care. I have a particular debt of gratitude to L'Arche for being that place which so inspired and transformed one of my favourite Christian thinkers and writers, Henri Nouwen.

Recently, to mark his 90th birthday, L'Arche posted a [YouTube video](#) in which Vanier, as spiritually and intellectually sharp as ever, reflected on his life and learnings. It's called "Jean Vanier's 10 Rules for Life to Become More Human," and it is personal, poignant and prophetic. The video is worth watching, or you can read a great summary from the UK Catholic journal, *The Tablet*, but here in summary are his 'rules':

1. Accept the reality of your body.
2. Talk about your emotions and difficulties.
3. Don't be afraid of not being successful.
4. In a relationship, take the time to ask, 'How are you?'
5. Stop looking at your phone! Be present.
6. Ask people, 'What is your story?'
7. Be aware of your own story.
8. Stop prejudice: meet people.
9. Listen to your deepest desire. Listen to it!
10. Remember that you'll die one day.

The summary hardly does justice to his eloquent, gentle but piercing challenge for us to live deeper and, consequently, larger lives than we mostly choose for ourselves. Vanier calls us to live from the core of our being – a core which, with all its light and shadow, beauty and dirt, honour and shame, strength and vulnerability, still expresses something of the image of God and can find something of its own healing in deep connection with others.

As I've been reflecting on Mental Health Week this week, I've been drawn back to these 10 points. Mental illness is very different from intellectual disability, but strategies for building resilient mental health also remind us to be more grounded about who we are, accepting our innate frailties and limitations, and living with gentleness and forgiveness for ourselves and others. The simplicity of good diet, exercise and sleep; of making time for creative self-expression and nurture; of choosing people and places that are life-giving, not draining; of keeping perspective; of saying 'no' and living a step and a day at a time. I also find the notion of the slow, patient work of God a useful antidote to the pace which I often bring to my work on God's behalf! Be blessed, body, mind and spirit.


Mental Health Week, October 6-14
