





FROM THE PRESBYTERY MINISTER

Act2 report gives plenty to think - and pray - about

The Assembly's national conversation about UCA renewal has been given substantial focus and momentum through the project team's release of their first report last month, "Act2: In response to God's call".

The full report is <u>available here</u> and is highly recommended reading for anyone interested in understanding the UCA's current situation and its challenges.

The report collates the feedback received from across the church – individuals, Congregations, Church Councils, Presbyteries and Synods – through direct submissions, focus groups, in-person consultations, online thematic discussions, 'town hall' gatherings, and meetings with church leaders and representatives.

One statistical 'finding' is that the UCA comprises approximately 1672 local communities with a typical weekly attendance of 28 people and an average age of 68. Behind these figures would be stories of church communities that are dying and some that are emerging; some that are inward-looking and some that remain open in the face of wider community decline.

Here are some of the positives about the UCA that were frequently mentioned in the discussions so far:

- Worship and pastoral care remain at the heart of local communities of faith. People believe their communities provide a strong sense of belonging and are inclusive.
- Communities of faith are also committed to connecting with their local community.
- Discipleship is both a source of life and a place for further work. There is a deep heart to be a Church that is more able to invite people into life-giving communities of faith and grow them in the way of Jesus.
- There is an appetite for church planting, fresh expressions and experimentation. Beyond some notable exceptions, this has tended to be relatively small communities.
- There is deep love for the Uniting Church and what it represents. The Basis of Union continues to have value as a foundational document for our life.
- Our commitments to the Covenant, being a multicultural church and seeking justice are also foundational. There is ongoing pride in the Uniting Church's extensive network of community services.
- People also appreciate that the Uniting Church is an inclusive church, that despite its differences it does seek to hold together a very broad range of beliefs and practices.
- People appreciate the principles that shape how we make decisions in community with all people, lay and ordained, regardless of gender, gathering to seek consensus.

- Local communities of faith expression frustration and confusion at times about the support they receive from the wider Church.
- Local communities see that their primary contributions to the wider Church are financial giving and appointing people to councils and committees.
- Some lament the decisions of the National Assembly meetings and the impact that has had on local communities of faith.
- There is a widespread view that the UCA's system of governance is no longer working as designed.
- The reliance on a high number of participants in unpaid roles (office bearers, council members, board members, committee members) is no longer viable.
- The assumption of a high level of collaboration between councils is leading to confusion of responsibilities, inefficiency and slow decision making.
- The intersection of concepts such as oversight, corporate governance, conciliar decision making, and individual decision making are causing widespread frustration.
- There is a mismatch between the scope of council responsibilities and the resourcing available.
- Property is now both a significant source of revenue and a burden to maintain for most communities. As an asset rich, cash poor Church, there is significant contest about the merits of property sales and the distribution of sales proceeds. There are significant pastoral, theological and ethical issues at stake in our use of our property resources.

These are just bare points, and the whole report is well worth reflection and discussion. This material will be reflected in the work of Presbytery and Synod meetings over the coming months, and every Church Council and Congregation should consider how this report might trigger fruitful conversations for their people.

There are uncomfortable truths and contestable views. As its authors say, "Not everything in this report is easy reading." But renewal begins with a grounded, realistic sense of who we are and of who God is, and a surrender to God's work of healing and transformation, of breaking down and building up, of pruning and planting.

The Act2 team offers their report "in a spirit of deep love for our Church, hope for our future, and faith that, in his own strange way, Christ constitutes, rules and renews his Church." Let's make this our prayer, and commit that we will not refuse God's invitation to discover afresh the divine purpose and plan for the UCA as a movement for renewal in the church and the world.
